BYE LAWS

Last updated 21st January 2021

Members should familiarise themselves with the P.P.U.I. rules and comply with same.

Members playing in competition have priority on the course over other players. Practice is not allowed during weekend club competitions and juvenile competitions.

The Club Captains and President shall have priority on the course over other members.

During weekend club competitions; three ball groups have priority over two ball groups.

Any 2 ball playing their first round must wait until 3 ball ahead are on the 4th tee box.

A maximum of two balls may be used during practice.

The 17th and 18th greens are not to be used for practice.

If grounds person is servicing a green it is out of play.

Mobile phones must be kept on silent and only used in case of emergency on the course.

The use of Wooden Tees is forbidden.

Golf shoes must be worn at all times when playing on the course, unless exempted by the Executive Committee.

Juvenile playing times shall be set by the Executive Committee. Juveniles under 10 years of age must be accompanied by an adult member at all times.

Members must wear suitable clothing & comply with the P.P.U.I. dress code when requested whilst at the club.

Members must pay any fees for competition entry promptly, within timescales, and without quibble.

Local rules for the playing of the game of pitch & putt may be introduced from time to time by the Executive Committee and these will be displayed in the committee room.

Green fees for visitors shall be set from time to time by the Executive Committee.

Pets are not allowed anywhere on the course or in the club house.

All Accidents must be recorded in the Accident Book which will be kept by the Honorary Secretary.

The Pool Table and Dart Board are in charge of the Bar Person on duty.

Membership Rates are as set by the membership at the Annual General Meeting. All Ordinary, Honorary & Juvenile members must be registered with Lucan to become a member of the Club.

SENIOR FEE: This applies to persons who have been an Adult member for 3 years and reached their 65th birthday (on March 1st of the current membership period). A new Senior member must pay the Adult fee for 3 years before they qualify for Senior rate.

Bar staff are authorised by the Executive Committee to refuse to serve drink to any member or visitor whom they deem to be intoxicated or abusive. Disciplinary action in line with section 10.1 of the Club's Constitution may be taken by the Executive Committee against any member who purchases drinks for a member or visitor who has been refused service by the bar staff.

Bar staff are authorised by the Executive Committee to request any member or visitor, who in their opinion has caused a serious breach of discipline, to leave the premises.

Disciplinary action in line with section 10.1 of the Club's Constitution may be taken by the Executive Committee against any Member who has been deemed to have breached the above Bye Laws
